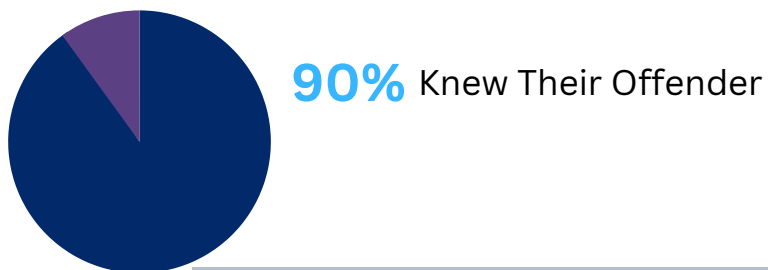
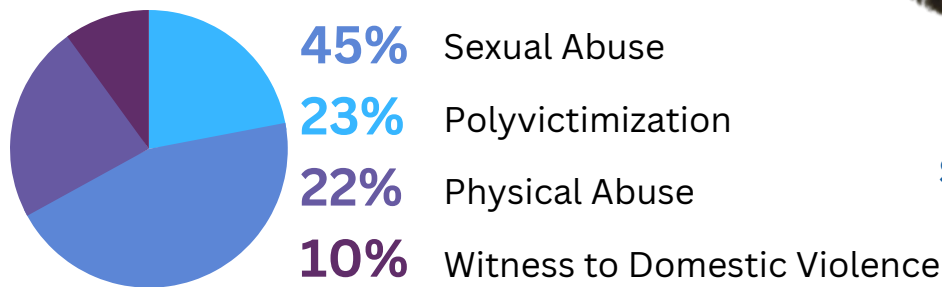
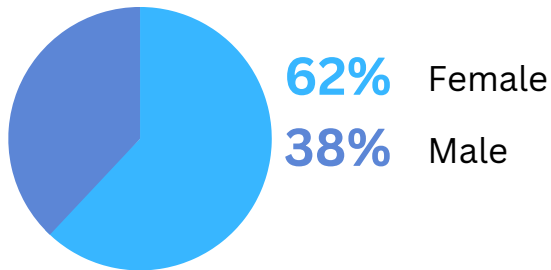

## WALK IN THEIR SHOES

### CHILDREN SERVED



**A typical child seen at the CAC is an 11-year-old girl who has been sexually abused by a family member.**

A 9-year-old girl was interviewed at the CAC and disclosed about multiple people who had abused her throughout her life. Later in the year, the same girl was brought back after witnessing abuse happen to someone else. She remembered her first visit to the CAC and told the forensic interviewer she **wanted to be like them when she grew up – listening to kids and asking questions to help keep them safe.**
