

MESSAGE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

It is truly amazing what can happen in a year! This time last year, our agency was filing legal paperwork as the newly formed Children & Family Advocacy Center (CFAC) – taking a 30+ year mission of supporting women and children and a 20+ year mission of empowering kids – to become the single mission of restoring lives of those impacted by trauma. By merging the two long-standing nonprofit agencies, we were able to **remove** barriers, **eliminate** duplicative services, and **expand** our organization's offering of a **comprehensive**, **individualized trauma response**.

Trauma knows no boundaries and it impacts every person differently. A specific goal plan is designed and tailored to each client, both adult and child, to aid them towards their complete healing. The response to trauma must not only be reactive, but preventative as well. A generational focus must be taken to break the cycle of abuse. Our goal is for our clients to transition from crisis to healing and to lead safe, healthy, and independent lives – where their trauma is only a small chapter of their journey that is still being written.

It was a year of firsts and a year of learning. Each team member was given ample opportunities to exercise our core values of excellence, growth, grit, and humble service. We were able to serve 919 children and families through acute services and 27 through residential services. Our main communal housing facility underwent an extensive remodel thanks to community partnerships. The project was completed towards the end of the year, which was a great reflection of our own journey of taking two "old" agencies, navigating a year of firsts, and creating "new." After the renovation, one of our young residents exclaimed, "It feels like home again" - and I couldn't agree more.

Because of your support, we can make old things new and create a home-like environment for those we serve to build community, find support, and learn to thrive despite the adversity they have experienced. We are grateful and excited for this next chapter as together we work to **restore** lives, break the cycle of abuse, and build resilient families.


